Due to the adverse conditions within the university at the time of my appointment I was required to take on all administration for teaching in social anthropology at very short notice. This required a high level of organisational management to finalise assessments, reading lists, teaching timetables, course structures, resits, deferrals and retakes, and to take over several complex issues concerning student pastoral care and support. Due to the sudden nature of the restructure this organisational work had to be completed successfully within three weeks.
